DIVORCE STATISTICS: The divorce rate in the US has gone above 43%. Russia 65%, UK 49% and Australia 49%. In 1998, there were 19.4 million divorced adults in the US. Each year 2.5 million more couples get divorced. The divorce ate in the "Bible Belt" is 50% higher than other areas of the country. This affects the lives of one million new children every year, 84% of whom live in single parent homes. With divorce so common today, nearly half of all marriages end in divorce. Today's reading about the importance of the indissolubility of marriage seems very relevant.
